Blowing the Whistle on GDC Scam.

Orthodontists and the General Dental Council are operating an illegal scam to withhold information from the public about new methods which can avoid almost all extractions and even major jaw surgery. This is being done partly to protect traditional methods and partly to preserve the high incomes of orthodontists and surgeons. Research suggests that this British development is being ignored in the UK while spreading rapidly abroad. As a result hundreds of children and young adults have extractions and jaw surgery, unaware they may be unnecessary.

Some Orthodontists mislead patients, saying that extractions can be avoided although the traditional methods they use leave too little room, risking severe damage to the face. It is wise to explore the internet yourself, many sites make great claims and show beautiful faces but very few show good results before and after treatment. Even the media is scared of disclosing this scandal.

Coding for kids

After the introduction of computing to the curriculum last year, children from the age of five will be taught about algorithms and learn how to write and test simple programmes. From age seven, pupils will be taught to understand the *World Wide Web* itself, looking at computer networks and the services they offer

E-safety is now also taught from when children start school at key stage one, helping them understand how to use technology safely and respectfully, how to keep information private, and where to go for help if they're worried about any content or contact on the internet

GCSEs for the modern world

GCSEs continue to get an overhaul, with new tougher qualifications designed to give pupils the knowledge and skills which will help them achieve their full potential.

This year sees the introduction of brand new GCSEs in English and maths with more new GCSE content in other subjects to follow next year

The new English literature GCSE requires students to study a more varied range of texts to help secure their love of reading and their knowledge of literature for life. By the end, they'll have read one play by Shakespeare, a nineteenth-century novel, a selection of poetry since 1789, including representative Romantic poetry, and fiction or drama from the British Isles from 1914

Practical maths

From this September teenagers will be able to study a new post-16 qualification, **Core Maths**, to help pupils who don't wish to continue the subject at AS / A Level to keep up these important skills. 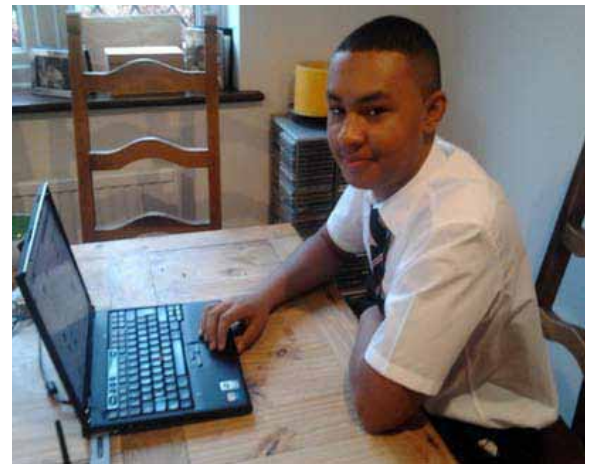

Kindness App Created To Combat Online Negativity

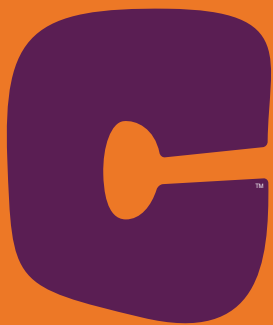

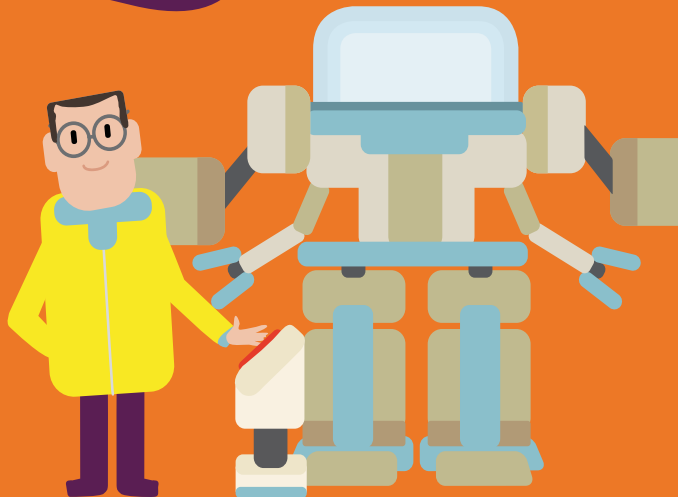

ENERGY DIP IMPACTS

Children are hungry when they get home from school and two thirds of parents surveyed said their child struggled with homework when energy levels were low. Hunger also affects children's moods and 38% of parents reported an after school snack or spending time with a parent put their child in a better frame of mind. 64% recognised that between-meal snacks could provide energy for children.

SNACK HABITS

Confectionery snacks are considerably more popular than fruit. 5-a-day fruit and vegetables are achieved by only 11% of boys and 8% of girls aged 11-18 years.

MOST LOVED AND LOATHED FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Research data from **Fruit Bowl** revealed what kids love or reject when it comes to fruit and vegetable preferences.

1. Bananas and strawberries come off best, liked by over one third of children (37-38%)
2. Carrots, peas and sweet corn (liked by 44%, 32% and 30% respectively)
3. Gooseberries and sprouts were liked the least by children.

Unfortunately this preference for confectionery skews children's snacking choices towards foods that are high in sugar, saturated fat and salt.

'HANGRY' KIDS LENGTHEN THE SCHOOL PICK UP BY UP TO 40 MINUTES

The school pick up has been deemed the most stressful time of day for nearly half of parents in the UK (45%) with many blaming it on the fact their child is hungry and angry at the same time, new research has revealed.

The research, commissioned by malt loaf makers **Soreen**, found that the average school pick up takes parents 15 minutes, but with a hungry child in tow it can take an average of ten minutes longer. Nearly two thirds of parents also admit that it can feel like it takes up to 40 minutes longer.

The study found that 14.48 is the time of day when kids feel their most hungry and by the time the bell rings at 15.20, parents agree that their children are often irritable, argumentative, and desperate for a snack.

Hunger pangs have been proven to significantly increase feelings of irritation and anger and the survey found that boys aged between four and 12, often suffer the most.

When kids feel 'hangry' parents admit that they can become argumentative (30%), irritable (22%) and short fused (17.5%).

Most parents have to take snacks for the journey home after school to stop their kids suffering from 'hanger' and one in three parents say that these often consist of sugary and fatty treats such as chocolate, sweets and crisps. If they forget a snack parents admit to feeling worried, stressed and apprehensive about the consequences.

These snack choices give children a sudden surge of sugar that will be short lived and are renowned for offering little nutritional value.

This may go some way to explain why a quarter of parents feel they have to give their children more than one snack to satisfy them, potentially jeopardising their next meal.
