



There's always something magical going on during the school holidays at *Battersea Park Children's Zoo*.

Children will love watching the charming meerkats from the secret look out tunnel, or admiring the cheeky capuchin and Bolivian squirrel monkeys swinging from the branches in their enclosure. The Asian short-clawed otters love a splash in their pool while emus Ant and Dec look down on visitors through their beautiful long lashes.

In the *Barley Mow Farm* the children can get to know miniature Shetland pony Feather, rabbits Charlie and Dexter, or Kune Kune pigs Wiggle and Piggle, while elsewhere the wallabies, donkeys, chickens, ring-tailed

Move over Cornwall - Kent might just have the edge when it comes to award-winning beaches

Environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy has announced this year's winners of the Blue Flag and Seaside awards. and Kent has received at grand total of 20 awards - more than any other county in the country.

Kent has a total of 11 Blue Flag beaches - again, the most in any UK county - in Thanet, Tankerton and Swale.

The county has gained two more Blue Flags this year, with Leysdown Beach regaining an award and Minster Leas receiving the accoldate for the first time

Visit Kent marketing director Jennifer Yard said: "We are thrilled that Kent has the most Blue Flag beaches and Seaside awards in the country.

"Thanet's has retained its seven Blue Flags, and both Tankerton beach and Sheerness beach have kept theirs. Swale has even more to celebrate this year as Leysdown Beach regained Blue Flag status, and Minster Leas has been awarded a Blue Flag for the first time ever.

"This brings the total number of Blue Flag beaches to 11 more than any other county in the country. We also have nine seaside awards.'

The Kent beaches award Blue Flags are Botany Bay, Joss Bay, Leysdown, Minnis Bay, Minster Leas, Ramsgate Main Sands, Sheerness, Stone Bay, St Mildreds, Tankerton and West Bav.

A total of 143 English beaches are flying a Blue Flag or have received a Seaside award this year. Both awards are the quality marks for beaches and mean they are clean, safe and meet the highest environmental standards, as well bathing water quality standards.

The awards are divided into local authority areas, but Kent is the English county with most awards in total.

Jennifer Yard added: "Having Blue Flag status is hugely important to any seaside destination – the fact that so much of our coastline has this world-renowned seal of approval makes us all the more appealing to holiday makers as we near the summer season.


