Blowing the Whistle on GDC Scam.

Orthodontists and the General Dental Council are operating an illegal scam to withhold information from the public about new methods which can avoid almost all extractions and even major jaw surgery. This is being done partly to protect traditional methods and partly to preserve the high incomes of orthodontists and surgeons. Research suggests that this British development is being ignored in the UK while spreading rapidly abroad. As a result hundreds of children and young adults have extractions and jaw surgery, unaware they may be unnecessary.

Some Orthodontists mislead patients, saying that extractions can be avoided although the traditional methods they use leave too little room, risking severe damage to the face. What are your options for screening for Down syndrome during pregnancy?

Down syndrome is the commonest chromosomal abnormality and there are several options on how to screen for it during pregnancy.

Combined Screening, the most frequently used test, detects around 85% of Down syndrome. It involves a scan and blood test at 11-13 weeks, giving you a risk of Down syndrome (e.g. 1 in 1000). It carries no risk to the pregnancy, but cannot give you a definite 'yes' or 'no' answer.

A new screening test: Free Fetal DNA testing is now available. It involves taking blood from you from 10 weeks onwards and can detect >99% of Down syndrome. There are several different tests available (e.g. the Harmony test) but none are currently available on the NHS. They are only available in private clinics at a cost of around £500. The test cannot give you a definite answer but carries no risk to the pregnancy.

Amniocentesis and CVS (Chorionic Villus Sampling) are diagnostic tests, which can give you a definite answer as to whether your baby has Down syndrome or another chromosomal abnormality. However, these tests both involve putting a needle into the womb and therefore carry a risk of miscarriage of around 1 in 100 (1%). CVS can be done from 11 weeks and involves taking a biopsy of the placenta and amniocentesis can be done from 15 weeks and involves taking some fluid from around the baby. Usually these 'diagnostic' tests are only done if you are considered high risk of having a baby with Down svndrome

Paralympian David Weir CBE was special guest of honour at the official opening of The Wooden Spoon Spider Therapy Room at the newly opened Freddie Farmer Foundation physiotherapy centre off Elliott Road, Bromley South They welcomed David and charity representatives from Wooden Spoon Kent to formally open the room which boasts state of the art equipment to help mobility for children with cerebral palsy and serious mobility problems. Your child's self-esteem - are you getting the balance right?

It can be quite challenging to build a child's self-esteem without overdoing it. There is a balance between too much praise and not enough.

With too little a child's self-esteem can suffer, but with too much children can develop a distorted sense of entitlement and their own abilities.

So what is healthy self-esteem? **Professor Matt Sanders**, founder of the *Triple P Positive Parenting Program* explains: Self-esteem is the term psychologists use to describe how a person feels about their innate worth as an individual, their skills and attributes, and how they interact with the world.

Under a daily bombardment of "winning is everything" advertising messages, it can be particularly hard for kids to learn to deal with disappointment, and/or to stop measuring themselves against impossible standards. This is an often-overlooked element of the development of healthy self-esteem.

True self-esteem is something we build up ourselves, as we work to master new skills, stick to our values, and show pro-social behaviours such as care and concern for others. Egotism, on the other hand, is an unhealthy focus on one's self and a disregard for others, a feeling of being better than

everyone else, and, often, a fear of failure.

Children who have what might be called artificially high self-esteem may have been given overblown praise for no real reason, or not taught to empathise with others. They may develop a sense of superiority, struggle to form healthy relationships, and find it hard to understand why they don't automatically succeed at everything they attempt.

Then there are the kids with low self-esteem. Many children who regularly misbehave already view themselves in a highly negative way. They may feel inadequate and/or lack the desire to achieve goals and face challenges. They may also believe bad things about themselves: that they are, and always will be, dumb, ugly, stupid, naughty etc.

Children who have healthy, balanced self-esteem are likely to be happy and cooperative and make friends easily. They're eager to learn and succeed, and they can cope with stress effectively.

Healthy self-esteem doesn't come built-in at birth. We first learn our view of ourselves during childhood, through the interactions we have with the people around us. So it's crucial for parents and carers to help our children develop a true

sense of their own strengths and weaknesses.

So how do you build healthy self-esteem in children?

1)Take a consistent, positive approach to their upbringing. Tell your child you love them, and demonstrate this by spending time talking to and playing with them. This helps your child feel valued and cared for.

2)Watch what you say.
Constant criticism can create low self-esteem, and make problem behaviour even worse.

3)Display confidence in their ability to persist. Let them attempt appropriate things by themselves. Teach them that mistakes are important ways of learning, and show them how to set realistic goals and work towards them.

4)Follow a healthy lifestyle. Taking care of one's self with regular exercise, healthy food, and grooming habits all help children develop a positive self-image.

5)Teach them to be balanced. When they've made an effort and mastered a new skill or achieved something, teach them to enjoy their accomplishments, without gloating or boasting. Help them understand that everyone is good at different things.

6)Teach them that life isn't always about winning. Your role is not to make every problem disappear or smooth over every bad feeling; instead. let your child express how they feel and assure them you understand. They'll develop a deeper sense of self-worth as they learn that with a bit of help from you, they can work out reasonable ways to deal with strong emotions. As a reaction to not getting what they want, children may sometimes put themselves down, saying things like "I'm dumb, you hate me", or "I'm just stupid". If this happens, try not to get dragged in to being overly sympathetic; instead, encourage your child to try again after the set-back, and to enjoy the activity or game

7)Encourage a sense of humour. Laughter really is a great medicine, and it doesn't hurt kids to see that even parents can laugh at themselves sometimes. Enjoying the little things in life helps people cope with tough times. Help your child to laugh by listening to their stories, playing games and having fun together.

even if they aren't the winner.

By following this advice parents can help their children develop healthy self-esteem – a gift that will stay with them throughout their lives.


